Darryl Hall is proud to hold three degrees from Tallahassee Community College. He spent four years in the Army before enrolling at TCC in the summer of 1987. He earned an associate in arts, an A.S. in Emergency Medical Services Technology, and an A.S. in Nursing. Education in hand, Darryl hit the ground running once he entered the world of healthcare. He spent time working for Calhoun County Emergency Medical Services before returning to work as a paramedic at Tallahassee Memorial Healthcare. Darryl's

nursing degree allowed him the opportunity to work in the ER, ICU, long-term care, rehabilitation, and Outpatient Services.

He turned to the administrative side of healthcare by joining Leon County Emergency Medical Services, where he has served for more than 30 years. He began as a field operations supervisor with EMS and continued to move up the ranks, serving as the Quality Improvement and Education manager before he was appointed deputy chief of operations for Leon County EMS in 2015, where he continues to serve.

Over the course of his career, Darryl has led efforts that resulted in improved survivability and outcomes.
