Mark Rominger started his law enforcement career in 1975. Early in his career, he held several leadership roles at the Manatee County Sheriff's Office, including roles as Shift Sergeant, Shift Commander, and later SWAT commander. In 1986, he joined the Florida Department of Law Enforcement as a Special Agent, where he served until 2000.

Mark's dedication led him to part-time employment as a Deputy with the Leon County Sheriff's Office, a Reserve Agent
