# Global Horizons International Student Scholarship Fund


#### A World Of Opportunity, Or Hope Denied?

**Cephas Kaburu** had a serious problem. The 21-year-old Kenyan student, who had arrived in the U.S. just two weeks before, received a phone call from home that shattered his dream of earning a degree from Tallahassee Community College. His financial sponsor had been murdered. As a result, he would have to return home immediately. His

family simply could not afford for him to attend college.

As if adapting to a new culture – and often having to gain a higher level of proficiency in the English language – weren't enough, International students face incredible financial barriers that most of us could not even begin to imagine. For starters, they must pay out-of-state tuition; a hurdle that sees them paying *four times* the rate paid by Florida residents. In addition, they often struggle to find and secure safe accommodations. Many landlords are understandably reluctant to rent to someone who does not have a U.S. credit history and cannot easily verify adequate family assets as evidence of their creditworthiness.

To make matters even more difficult, international students are prohibited from working off campus while they attend college. The sole exception is for those fortunate enough to land one of a very few OPS jobs available on



In 2011-12, Tallahassee Community College's international student cohort boasts students from 86 countries. Their presence on campus helps to make TCC a rich, diverse environment that benefits all of our students. Fortunately for Cephas, the TCC Foundation was able to muster up enough support for him to stay enrolled for his first semester. This bought him critical time to find the finances necessary to continue his education. However, his ultimate fate remains uncertain. The situation is just as precarious for many other TCC students.
